### What is the purpose of Fulbright?

Fulbright aims to increase mutual understanding between the people of the U.S. and other countries through the exchange of individuals, knowledge, and skills. Grants provide U.S. students the opportunity to live, learn, and engage in a host country for one academic year.

### What types of Fulbright opportunities are available?

Fulbright offers a variety of overseas options, including:

- Teaching English as an assistant
- Conducting independent research (may require a letter of support from a host country)
- Pursuing a graduate degree (limited number of opportunities)

### Fulbright funding is under review

Students are strongly encouraged to apply to Fulbright and to explore other international programs as a backup or complement. Because Fulbright is federally funded, students should also consider non-federally funded programs.

### Examples of Non-Federal Opportunities:

- JET – Teach English in Japan
- EPIK – Teach English in Korea
- NALCAP – Teach English in Spain
- DAAD – Research internships and study in Germany
- Gates Cambridge – Graduate study at the University of Cambridge
